Thank you to everyone who played a part in making the 42nd annual Gala dinner/auction another success! Organizers estimate that the 2023 Gala was the best to date, with a net of more than \$305,000 including \$27,306 raised that night for the renovation of the school's science wing restrooms. The grand auction had amazing items this year including a private plane flight for six individuals from Columbus to Kansas City for a Chiefs football game selling for \$18,000. This is Scotus' largest annual fundraiser, and the general proceeds are used to balance the school's budget.

Teacher of the Year



Jeff Ohnoutka presented the 25th annual William & Barbara Gerhold Family Teacher of the Year award to Scotus teacher, Carmen Johnson after a school Mass celebrated during this year's Catholic Schools Week. The award, which includes a \$1,500 stipend, is made available to any Columbus Catholic School teacher.

Carmen has taught Family & Consumer Science and Religion at Scotus for 34 years. She earned a bachelor's degree from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, College of Home Economics, and she provides an outstanding example of Catholic stewardship for Scotus, her parish and her community of Osceola, NE. At Scotus, Carmen is a co-chair for the Gala children's silent auction table, junior class sponsor and member of the Scotus Teachers Organization. She is active in St. Vincent Parish, Osceola, as a PRE instructor and coordinator and she is a past president of the altar society. She also volunteers as a 4-H leader, helping facilitate 4-H workshops, volunteering in the state 4-H building, superintendent for 4-H clothing day, and as a judge at many county and state level competitions.

The Teacher of the Year award is made possible through the William and Barbara Gerhold Family endowed fund. Besides supporting the annual teacher of the year award, this fund also provides an annual distribution to one of the four Columbus Catholic schools on a rotating basis (\$3,500 to St. Isidore School this year.) Scotus Central Catholic receives the residual of the fund's annual earnings, \$11,872.25 this year, to support the academic departments of Mathematics, Science and English. The endowed fund was established in 1998 with a gift of \$196,387, and to date, the fund has distributed \$254,367.

JOHN MAUSBACH '77 – was inducted into the Durango High School "Trailblazers Hall of Fame" at a program held on February 9, 2023. At the time of his induction, Coach Mausbach had been coaching football, track and field, and boys and girls golf for forty-two years, and twenty-five of those years at Durango HS. He began coaching football in 1981 at Kearney Catholic HS in Nebraska, then went on to be a graduate assistant coach for Northern Arizona U. from 1982-84 before moving to

Las Vegas. He was an assistant coach at Las Vegas HS and Valley HS from 1985-91 and became the head coach at Valley in 1992. He moved to Durango HS in 1994 and was the head football coach from 1996 until 2007. After stepping down as the head coach he continued to serve as an assistant coach with Durango until 2019 and has been an assistant coach at Liberty HS since. In addition to football at Durango, Coach Mausbach was an assistant track & field coach (1996-2007), head boys and girls golf coach (2009-2019) and athletic director (2009-2016.) He was the 1999 Southern Nevada HS Football Coach of the Year, inducted into the Southern Nevada HS Football Hall of Fame in 2007, named the JROTC Teacher of the Year in 2005 and was named NIAA Athletic Director of the Year in 2011. Established in 1993, Durango High School is a public school in the Clark County School District, Las Vegas, NV and serves approximately 2,300 students.
